Did You Know?

- Frogs shed their skin once a week – and eat it
- The 'tree frog' can jump 7 feet
- A group of frogs is called an 'army of frogs'
- Baby frogs are called 'tadpoles' or 'polliwogs'
- Frogs catch food (bugs, flies, worms, slugs,) with their tongue
- A frog's tongue is ½ the length of its body
- Frogs are 'amphibians', in the family of toads and salamanders
- Some frogs 'hibernate' in the mud in the winter
- Frogs sleep with their eyes open
- Herpetologists' are people who study frogs

Do You Know?

- Foxes are in the dog family with wolves, coyotes, and jackals
- Coyotes, wolves, and eagles, and the short-tailed lynx cat eat foxes
- Foxes eat rodents, squirrels, insects, birds, and chickens
- A fox weighs only 6-8 pounds.
- A male fox is a 'dog fox'; female is a 'vixen'; babies are 'cubs' or 'pups'
- Foxes live alone, but if they get together, the group is called a 'skulk'
- Some kinds of foxes are: Gray fox, Red fox, Arctic fox, Kit fox, and Fennec fox
- Foxes live in North America
- Foxes sometimes like to play with a live mouse and then let him go
